How long is the course?

This course provides the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to a casualty. It is suitable for workplace requirements and members of the public who wish to train in first aid. It is recommended that the course is renewed every three years.

The Australian Resuscitation Council recommends that CPR is refreshed on an annual basis.

PROVIDE FIRST AID

This unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to a casualty.

COMPULSORY PRE-COURSE WORK

IMPORTANT NOTE:

This course requires a level of physical capability to meet the performance evidence requirements. This relates to the ability to provide uninterrupted cardio pulmonary resuscitation on an adult manikin on the floor and an infant manikin placed a firm surface over a period of 2 minutes, and respond to an emergency situation where there may be risk to life.

If a candidate is physically unable to meet the assessment requirements, cannot perform resuscitation and/or First Aid to the required standards, a nationally recognized statement of attainment cannot be issued. In these instances a certificate of completion will be issued to the unsuccessful candidate.

Learners who attain competency will be awarded a Statement of Attainment.
