Enrolment Requirements

Eligibility to Study this Course

- Be an Australian Residence or Citizen, or have an appropriate visa to study this accredited certificate.
- Be reasonably fit and physically capable of performing the role.
- Meet the foundation skills (literacy and numeracy levels) necessary to perform in the role.
- Preferable to have some experience in leisure and health services.
- National Police Clearance certificate.
- Be able to sign a Statutory Declaration about criminal history at enrolment.
- USI Number (Unique Student Identifier). If you don't have one, you can apply online www.usi.gov.au.
